Old Business

- Blueberry Hills sidewalks – raised. McGlynn expressed concern about making repairs to a homeowner’s sidewalk. Bill Watt discussed the need to put a sidewalk ordinance in place. Based on 2019-1, Robert Webb noted that the tree well near a sidewalk is the homeowner’s responsibility. Bill Watt noted that the borough should make property owners aware that they are responsible.

New Business

- Sidewalk Ordinance – Bill Watt will research drafts to present to council
 - Gromelski questioned moving a no parking sign on White Street; instructed Danny to move to public property.
- Parking Ordinance – McGlynn questioned how the borough could prohibit property owners from parking large vehicles on streets; Robert Webb noted that Wilkes Barre is presenting a similar ordinance this week, with the exception of delivery trucks; Jef Bauman discussed the nuisance of large vehicles on the streets in the lower Duryea; also noted addressing the vehicles from auto garages parking vehicles on streets
- Jef Bauman questioned the rental registration and inspection ordinance and if it was in place; a discussion was had as to how to handle notifications.
